From the ARP Moderator CALL TO PRAYER

My Dear Friends,

Your response to the coronavirus pandemic inspires me in new ways each day as I hear of how our pastors and congregations are maximizing electronic and other means that make it possible for their people to worship and be served in many other ways. With the apostle, I can honestly say, "I thank my God every time I remember you." (Philippians 1:3). I am more convinced with each passing day that God, who has all this under His ultimate control, will turn this time into something good for Himself and for His church. Time will tell us what that will be, but I am convinced that Romans 8:28 holds true for each of us in such a time as this.

Each passing day brings news of the growing seriousness of this global viral crisis. For that reason, I write to you now asking that you join me in a season of prayer that God will quickly bring a positive end to this worldwide pandemic. As your Moderator, I am asking that we each would stop whatever we may be doing at 10 o'clock Eastern time each morning and pause in united prayer not only for an end to the pandemic but for a time of national and international revival. We are assured by God's word that, "If my people who are called by my name humble themselves, and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven and will forgive their sin and heal their land" (2 Chronicles 7:14). Let us claim this promise now!

Being conscious that many of you deal daily with health issues that make fasting medically inadvisable, I will not ask all of you to fast with me. However, where you are able and feel so inclined, perhaps you would join me in a time of fasting for a worldwide revival.

Pastors, by means of this letter, I am asking you to call your people to **join us in prayer at 10 o'clock each morning**. Please also call your non-ARP pastor friends and invite them and their congregations to join us also. Let's get God's people praying!

As always, you will be in my prayers each day. Keep up the good work for Jesus' sake.

From the Pastor

"Since then we have a great high priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus, the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession. For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sin. Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need."

(Hebrews 4:14-16 ESV)

The Bible talks a lot about prayer as a means of coming before the Lord, communing with Him, and bringing our requests to our God. Since we're now in the midst of the current pandemic, prayer should be our first response and our daily practice as we bring our fears, doubts, and needs *"to Him who is able to do far more abundantly than all that we ask or think"* (Ephesians 3:20 ESV). As most of us are aware, the Moderator of the General Synod of the Associate Presbyterian Church has called us all to a time of prayer at 10am every day during this crisis and I hope each of you would make the effort to pray at that time, or at another time. In light of this call to prayer let me share with you some of the issues over which we can pray.

First, pray for yourselves, your families, your friends, neighbors and coworkers. We see this throughout the Bible but especially in the life of the Apostle Paul. He continually prayed for the churches as he writes in his letters which are now part of Scripture. We can pray for one another's well-being, for protection, for provision of needs, for comfort and peace, and even for spiritual growth and trust in God.

Second, pray for those one the front lines such as our medical professionals and our first responders as well as those who are specifically involved in helping us through this crisis. Many of them are in the line of fire, as we say, and are potentially giving their lives in order to help those who contract this virus. As such, their lives are always in danger as they seek to serve the rest of us. This includes even our military as they've been called to active duty in our country.

Thirdly, pray for our government leaders whether federal, state, or local communities. They all have a heavy weight placed upon them during this time and will have to consider a variety of decisions regarding both our health and well-being as well as our economic future. These are not easy decisions, but we know that God holds the heart of the king in His hands (Proverbs 21:1). Ask God to give them wisdom as they seek to enact provisions that will be what's good for all.

Finally, pray for God's glory to be evident and effective as we face this pandemic throughout the world. One of the things that happens when a crisis comes, whether to us as individuals or to a nation, is that people begin to rethink their lives. As such, they become more open to the gospel and begin to seek out God as they search for answers and even for security. God often uses times of trouble to bring people to Himself and so pray that His glory would be evident and that the Holy Spirit would *"convict the world concerning sin and righteousness and judgment"* (John 16:8 ESV). Maybe this could actually be the next great revival in our world.

One of the ways we can pray together is through the ZOOM portal pastor Chris has set up. Using a computer or cell phone we meet at 10am every weekday morning in response to the call of our denomination's moderator. Betsy sent out an email with the information and I'd love to see some of you joining together with us in prayer. If you want to join and even pray just let Pastor Chris know and he'll give you an opportunity to pray. If you just want to join and silently pray with us, you can do that also. At the time I am writing this we've just started and had our first "prayer meeting" which worked very well. So, I hope to see some of you there.

We have an awesome God who knows what's going on and will come to our help. We see that in the promise made to us in the Scriptures above. Jesus has opened the path straight to the throne of grace where we will find sufficient grace to meet our every need. As His beloved people, we are the only ones who have this access because it comes to those who are in Jesus. Let's pray then and take advantage of God's love being expressed to us as we bring our concerns and requests to God who will hear and answer the cries of His people.

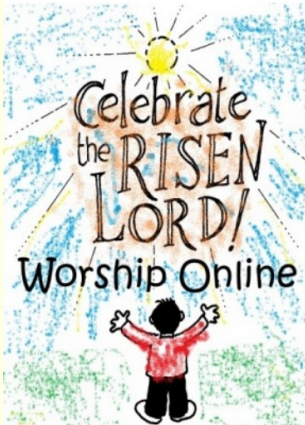

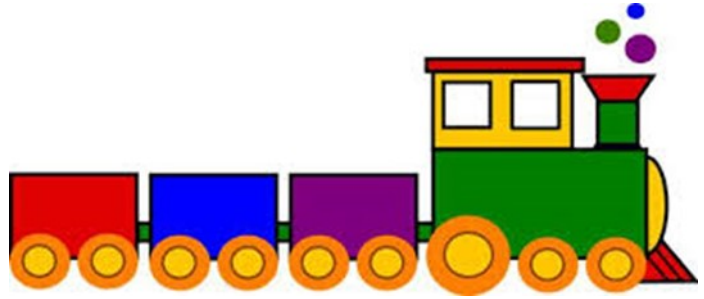

Hope you are ALL well and healthy. We continue to pray that this virus will clear out before they are saying it will. All things are possible with God!



Just want to update you on the situation presently. The first Soup Nite in March, seemed so long ago, but we served Kielbasa soup with crackers and a yummy peanut butter bar for dessert. I honestly don't know much about that night because I was out of town, but Jane said it went well, just a bit slow. There was some soup left over which was frozen to use at a later day. Well, that day came on our second Soup Nite! I have a few of our guests' emails and cell phone numbers, so we called them to see if they would like meals delivered. This list included, Xaiver and Mr. Winfrey's family, Henry Kurtz and his family and Lori Johnson and her family. I was able to make four crockpots of Creamy Chicken Chili, which is what we were going to make anyhow. I also defrosted that delicious Kielbasa soup. So these families got 2 meals, along with dessert (as Jane dropped off some homemade banana bread), rolls, corn bread and drinks. Sal mapped the houses out to be delivered to and everyone got meals, with no contact at all. I was also able to get a couple of senior meals done too. We did deliver 36 meals to the SWL program this month. That program is still happening over at the Food CoOp. By the way, the CoOp is doing a drive thru system where you wait in your cars and they will have your pantry items boxed up and load them in the car for you, no contact. Sounds like it's working, so I would like to see for myself just how it is running. It might be a good model to follow or maybe tag a meal onto what they are doing.

Our board will meet in April to discuss our next Soup Nites. We have one Soup Nite the day after Easter, which we were going to buy pizzas so nobody had to cook. The last Soup Nite is supposed to be a chicken pasta salad. However, so much has changed now, we will definitely keep you posted. PLEASE...PLEASE stay well. Jane and I remember you in our prayers. Pray for us as we make decisions about serving going forward. There is no fear with God and we praise Him for blessing us through the pandemic.

The news seems to be a constant barrage of information about Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19). It's easy to react to this news with fear and a feeling of uncertainty about the news you do see. Please know that the American Red Cross is monitoring and adapting daily to the evolving situation.

ESSENTIAL ACTIVITY – Many organizations have limited “nonessential activity”, but the blood drive scheduled at your location in May is an essential activity, as outlined by the Center for Disease Control (CDC) and the Food and Drug Administration (FDA). NO TRANSMISSION BY BLOOD – There have been no reported cases of any respiratory virus being transmitted by blood, including this coronavirus (COVID-19). Donating blood is a safe process and people should not hesitate to give blood.
