<u>From the Pastor</u>

"For this reason I bow my knees before the Father, from whom every family in heaven and on earth is named, that according to the riches of His glory He may grant you to be strengthened with power through His Spirit in your inner being, so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith—that you, being rooted and grounded in love, may have strength to comprehend with all the saints what is the breadth and length and height and depth, and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, that you may be filled with all the fullness of God."

(Ephesians 3:14-19 ESV)

Do you realize the reality of just how much God loves you? Sometimes I wonder if we're a little bit too quick to answer that question in the affirmative. If I were to ask you whether or not you knew God loves you, you would probably tell me that you did understand it and even accept His love as a reality in your life.

As believers we certainly should understand that our redemption is the direct result of God's love for us as God the Son came into this world in the person we know as Jesus in order to redeem us from sin and it's impending consequences. We also should know there's no greater love that could ever be expressed than the love of our Savior who fully gave Himself, sacrificing His own life, not for any reason of worthiness in us, but simply because He chose to love us. In fact, there is no greater love than that of one person giving up of his or her life for another. As we've often heard "it's the ultimate sacrifice." However, in light of all that, and even so much more, we can sadly understand it from a purely intellectual point of view, knowing the facts about such acts of love, without really understanding it fully.

It's interesting to me how the Apostle Paul prays for the believers in Ephesus that they would "have strength to comprehend with all the saints what is the breadth and length and height and depth, and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge." These were believers who had come to faith in Jesus and certainly should have knowledge that their salvation was the result of God's love toward them. And yet he still prays that they might have strength to comprehend that love which surpasses knowledge.

Now, think about that for a moment. How can we comprehend that which surpasses knowledge? The truth is, we simply can't. So, what is the Apostle Paul getting at when he asks this of God in his prayer? I believe it's about a continual aspect of our growth in grace by which we experience the reality of God's great love for us as we mature in our faith. You see, in this lifetime we'll never truly comprehend the breadth and length and height and depth of God's love for us, but we can grasp more and more of His wondrous love through Jesus as we continue our growth in spiritual maturity. Listen, the love of which the Apostle Paul is speaking is the love that's ours in Jesus which is more greatly understood as He becomes more preeminent in our lives through the continual increase of God's fullness in us.

It's been several weeks since this pandemic brought about our time of isolation in which we have had the opportunity to express love for one another by staying away from one another. That sounds kind of strange, doesn't it? However, we all know how this is an act of Christian love. And it's in this time while we're sheltering at home that, perhaps, we may wonder about God's love in the midst of this crisis. But I believe that it's in the midst of crisis that God's people can more readily grasp His love because it's in the midst of our struggles that we look to Him and experience the greatness of His love for us. We can experience it through the contacts of friends and family. We can experience it in the answering of prayer. We can also experience it in our loss as He comes to comfort us.

It's my prayer as well that all of us will grow in our understanding of God's love and just how broad, high, long, and deep is this love for us in Jesus Christ.





Dear Youth,

For the past 6 weeks, life has been very different than it was before. Many of you have been quarantined at home. Some of you know someone who is sick with COVID-19, and some have lost loved ones to this virus. On top of the fear, sorrow, and frustration you face daily because of these life circumstances, you have also been tasked with completing this school year at home. This has provided an all new set of struggles and challenges as you do all of the hard parts of school without any of the blessings of being together. I can imagine that many of you are feeling weary and tired, and especially worn down.

In youth group, we often talk about trials and temptations, struggles and sorrows – and I know many of you now know the pain of life's trials in a much different way. Things that you thought would never change have suddenly changed. Adults in your life who once seemed certain about the world and the future are suddenly uncertain and sometimes fearful. Even my four year old has expressed this feeling recently with a bedtime speech about everything that has changed and a cry of "*Why does everything change?*"

Jesus Christ, our Lord, has some words of encouragement for us from the gospel written by John. *"I have said these things to you, that in me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation. But take heart; I have overcome the world." John 16:31*

We do not have to lose heart because the world is strange. Our hope is not in this world but in the Creator of this world. Our hope is in Jesus Christ. He is our peace. During this time, persevere with school, be kind to your family, look for how God is at work in good ways, and open your heart to God – share your struggles, failings, hopes, dreams, fears, *everything* with Him. Watch what He will do! Because we can be sure of one thing – that the Lord our God loves us. I miss each of you dearly and hope to see you soon.

What a treat is was to serve so many meals this month. Right when you think.....how are we going to get people fed when there is a pandemic going on and

we are not gathering together? God always has a way!!!

Early in the month, on the 13th, we brought over 200 gift cards from McDonalds to the Food CoOp to hand out for us. These were \$5 gift cards and McD's threw in a free sandwich card. What a blessing to so many families that I heard people were literally crying! Donations were so generous last year that only the Lord knew we would need that money for an occasion such as this. Additionally, on the 13th, we delivered meals to five Soup Nite families in our area. We also made senior meals to be delivered as well as getting a large donation of chicken dinners from Outback Steakhouse in Swannee that were made just for our seniors. We picked up another round of meals from them again last week. They came to reach out to us from the word getting out from the Friends of Gwinnett Seniors program. Thank you to those of you for picking up these meals and for those of you who made senior meals these past two weeks!

On the 27th, we delivered meals to nine (number increased) of our Soup Nite families in the area, which made 39 meals for this group. On Tuesday, the 28th, we delivered senior meals again without Outback's meal as this route is small. We hope to get meals again next week from Outback as long as they are still willing to make them. On Wednesday, the 29th, several of our members made the Chicken Pasta Salad for us to serve over at the Food CoOp. They supplied the tent, table and gloves for

us. Cars started driving thru at 9:45 and by 11:15 we handed out 254 meals with cookies! So AMAZING! There were still cars coming in and I'm sure that we could have served another 100 easily. Feeling bad about the people who didn't get meals, LaShawn, the pantry manager at the Food CoOp says, "People who needed to get a meal, got one. People who didn't get a meal, didn't need to get one this time." Yes, God knows all things and we did our very best. We answered a call and what blessings did we get in return! Just got to say that while I don't like to tell numbers, we served over 500 meals this month, including the gift cards, Soup Nite meals and senior meals. Not going to lie, I'm crying right now.

Thank you to ALL who picked up ingredients to prepare, those who bought their own to prepare, those who prepared senior meals and Soup Nite meals, those who picked up gift cards and Outback meals, those who defrosted nasty, block hard chicken for days, those who packed up coolers and containers, those who served, those who made deliveries and for the prayers!

It was a busy, busy month. Take next week off to breathe. I will keep you posted about May's Soup Nite and SWL senior meals! We have no plan yet, but God does. Laura Drake, director at the Food CoOp, calls the volunteers God's Army. I think Soup Nite's volunteers are God's Regiment, small but mighty. Jane and I appreciate all that you do to serve our

Lord and our community.
