From the Paston

"Blessed is the man who perseveres under trial, because when he has stood the test, he will receive the crown of life that God has promised to those who love him."

(James 1:12 NIV)

Most people I know don't like to face times of difficulties. In fact, if you are anything like me you would most likely do anything and everything you can to avoid the hard times of life. I know I don't like to even contemplate the idea of suffering, whether it comes through areas of health, finances, persecution, or any other aspect of trouble, let alone have to endure it. That's certainly true of our current situation and I'm hopeful this will end soon.

However, did you notice that the Apostle James tells us that we receive a blessing from God when we face trials and persevere through them? Now, I will have to admit that I certainly like the blessing of God on my life and I hope that each of you do as well. No one can bless us as our Lord can bless us. Our God is a God who delights in blessing His people. So it seems to me that if we want to experience the fullness of God's blessings, then perhaps we need to rethink our position of facing the trials that come in life.

Now, don't think I have suddenly developed a martyrdom complex, as if I'm trying to get all of us to start looking for ways we can make our lives more difficult just so we can experience more of God's blessings. I'm not advocating that at all. However, I have found times in my life when I have refrained from ministry and service simply because of the difficulty I might face or the inconvenience I may have to endure.

Perhaps you've experienced that as well. You know, those times when God presents us with an opportunity to minister to someone, but we'll have to change our schedule or miss out on something important to us. God may present us with a situation to be of service to someone, but that might mean we will have to go without or sacrifice a little and the pain that results is just too much to bear. There might even be an opportunity to share the gospel with a friend or relative and we refrain because of the ridicule that may result or the fear of not being able to adequately explain the good news of salvation in Jesus.

Then there are the other types of suffering that come with little or no explanation like we're experiencing now. Our health might begin to fail. We might lose a job or a promotion. A friend or a loved one is suddenly taken from us and we turn our anger and bitterness toward God, and we begin to doubt His love, mercy, and grace. There are many who face such times and they turn completely away, failing the test of their faith in Jesus. I'll be the first to say that I can't explain why these things happen to us and we probably won't know until we reach our home in our Father's house. However, I believe what James says when he tells us that we are blessed when we persevere, that is, when we keep our faith and trust in the Lord our God.

We have a God who does love us. His love is forever displayed and proven to us through the cross of our Lord Jesus. How could we ever doubt so great a love as God Himself coming to earth in human form so He could redeem and rescue the likes of us? You see, it's when we keep our focus on Jesus, remembering His sacrifice for us, that I believe we'll more easily persevere through the difficulties of life. We'll be more willing to go without, to sacrifice, in order to minister and serve those who need our help. We'll be able to share the gospel with those who have not heard. We'll be able to keep the faith even in those times we face the most difficult of trials that may not make any sense to us. And when we persevere through all the troubles of life, keeping our faith fixed upon Jesus, we'll receive, as James points out, the blessing of the crown of life that God has promised to those who love Him.

Highlands Women's Ministry


"Be strong and courageous! Do not be afraid, do not be discouraged. The Lord your God will be with you wherever you go." Joshua 1:9

UPDATE OF HPC REOPENING STATUS FOR IN-PERSON WORSHIP & ACTIVITIES As of June 1, 2020

Your Session remains sensitive to and empathetic with a possible sense of disorder and probable feelings of isolation this health crisis has generated in all our lives since March of this year. However, good news is on the horizon; as many of you know, the final phase of Georgia's stay-at-home order restrictions are scheduled to expire June 12th. So, for many of us, in a couple of weeks we can begin to venture out and visit our neighbors and friends should we choose to do so.

However, the pandemic is NOT over and to reach any sense of normalcy in our daily lives still will require various steps of preparation; more analysis of consistent, reliable data with favorable results from observations over time; and a careful game plan that will ensure our safety and mitigate the potential risk of further exposure of the virus for our entire Congregation.

The Pastors, Session, and Diaconate have had their "ears to the ground" and our voices lifted in prayer for various sources of information regarding an effective and safe HPC reopening process:

- Worship Team has shared recommendations/ suggestions from the Synod for review
- 2. News items from the Governor's Office with specific Georgia statistics at local, county, and state level
- 3. ARP Magazine
- 4. Informal individual discussions
- 5. Other news media relevant items of information

The Session desires to be very deliberate, careful, judicious, and obedient to our Sovereign Lord as we study, plan, and implement the process of when and how HPC resumes worshipping together in person. Many of you are aware of at least one obstacle to overcome – a lack of consistently accurate statistical data (at all levels *including Georgia*) that drives the national and state recovery phases to determine what set of restrictions should be enforced. BEFORE we implement HPC's reopening plan, your Session wants to be very certain via observation over time with hard evidence (based on data) that our state and county have reached a point where we can say with a high degree of confidence: "We can begin to resume community worship keeping our Congregation safe and healthy and mitigating the risk of potential exposure to COVID-19."

Later this month, the Session will begin formal discussions laying the framework and foundation for our resumed inperson Worship and other ministry activities. We are hopeful that the data reporting will get better during June and provide us with a clearer status of where Georgia stands overall in terms of the recovery phases from the pandemic. This in turn will assist our planning efforts regarding any further restrictions that may still be in effect.

At this time, we will continue to worship together in Spirit through our online streaming of worship services. Your elders will continue to monitor requirements for moving forward in this dynamic, ever-changing environment. Should you have questions or concerns, feel free to contact any member of the Session or one of the Pastors. Please stay safe and healthy!

Highlands is waiting on the Gwinnett County Public School System to determine what the 2020-2021 school year will look like at Highlands! Please be in prayer for



Highlands Benevolence Fund Policy (Adopted by the Session at their November 2019 meeting)

Galatians 6:10 states "Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers." Highlands' officers used this verse, among others, as the basis for establishing a Benevolence Fund Policy to benefit our church family. They recognized that sometimes the need for charitable assistance seems overwhelming but they also were aware that the Lord says, "...whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me."

The Benevolence Fund Policy is administered by a team of three deacons, one from each class of officers, assisted by one Elder and having oversight from the Diaconate Chairman and the appointed Elder. The team has the responsibility of reviewing applications for assistance and either approving or denying those requests. They are also responsible for encouraging donations from the church membership for the Benevolence Fund (there will be more information concerning this in the near future.)

Requests for assistance may be made by a church member, an immediate family member or regular visitors and the need should be of a critical nature that the requestor is unable to meet on their own. A request may be made of any active officer or one of the church pastors. One of these leaders may assist in the application process

with the intention of turning over the request to a team member. It is the intention of the officers that these gifts be a one-time gift, but it is also recognized that unusual circumstances do occur. Confidentiality and promptness in handling these requests are encouraged.

Gifts to the Benevolence Fund are given freely and unconditionally, without regard to a specific need and over and above the tithe. Gifts from the Benevolence Fund are considered a gift from the Highlands church family and should not be construed as a loan.

This is an overall summary of the Benevolence Fund Policy. The entire document may be read online in the Members section of the website. Applications may be downloaded from the website and are also available in the

church office. Questions may be directed to one of the Benevolence Fund Team members – Deacons Justin Jacques, Phillip Wallace, or Fru Chifen or Elder Lee Hunt.



GIVING TITHELY - ONLINE GIVING

Effective July 1, Highlands ARP is changing our online giving platform to **<u>tithe.ly</u>**. The format is similar to ones that we have been using in that donations by credit card or debit card (fees are 2.9% +\$.30/transactions) and bank transfers (1% fee) are both an option. There will be an option for you to cover the credit card fee as well.

The website is easy to understand -

- 1. You have the option of donating to predetermined funds (General Fund, Benevolence Fund, Soup Nite Ministry, Missions, etc.)
- 2. You may set up the frequency of regular gifts (weekly, bi-weekly, semi-monthly or monthly)
- 3. You may elect to cover the credit card processing fees
- 4. You may select a bank draft or a credit/debit card payment

In about 2 weeks, you will receive an email that details the specifics of the platform, but it is very similar to other online giving sites.


