#### HPC REOPENING STATUS FOR IN-PERSON WORSHIP & ACTIVITIES As of August 1, 2020

Since the last HPC Newsletter was published, the HPC Pastors and Session conducted meetings on June 14<sup>th</sup> and July 26<sup>th</sup> to discuss further plans to reopen HPC for in-person worship and activities.

A key action item from our June 14<sup>th</sup> meeting was to formulate and implement an outline/plan to conduct an abbreviated worship service to observe the Lord's Supper (Communion) with limited in person attendance while following appropriate safety and distancing guidelines. We conducted the Communion Worship Services on July 12<sup>th</sup> using three sessions held in the Fellowship Hall. We had reasonably good participation and received such positive feedback that we plan to conduct these Communion services monthly beginning Sunday, August 9, 2020. Please reserve your family's desired session and time using the HPC website or by calling the Church Office.

Many of the Corona Virus metrics for Gwinnett County are not what we hoped they would be by the end of July. For example, the sheer number of Gwinnett cases between June 21 (6,000+) and July 26 (15,000+) more than doubled – which is

not an encouraging sign of a steady reduction in Covid-19 incidences. However, on a more positive note at the state level as of July 29<sup>th</sup>, another metric that factors in case volume, testing volume, and number of positive case results reached a numeric value of less than one – an indication that Georgia as a whole has reached a significant point where the Covid-19 spread rate is declining.

For now, HPC will continue to worship together in Spirit blessed by our online streaming of Sunday worship services. In the meantime, the Pastors and Session will continue to monitor requirements and feasibility for moving forward safely in this dynamic environment. We would ask the following of the Congregation: 1) Please continue to pray; 2) If comfortable, consider attending in-person Communion Services; and 3) Stay safe and healthy.

Thank you for your patience; and should you have questions or concerns, feel free to contact any member of the Session or one of the Pastors.

#### From the Pastor

"Blessed is the man who perseveres under trial, because when he has stood the test, he will receive the crown of life that God has promised to those who love him."

(James 1:12 NIV)

Most people I know don't like to face times of difficulties. In fact, if you are anything like me you would most likely do anything and everything you can to avoid the hard times of life. I know I don't like to even contemplate the idea of suffering, whether it comes through areas of health, finances, persecution, or any other aspect of trouble, let alone have to endure it. That's certainly true of our current situation and I'm hopeful this will end soon.

However, did you notice that James tells us that we receive a blessing from God when we face trials and persevere through them? Now, I will have to admit that I certainly like the blessing of God on my life and I hope that each of you do as well. No one can bless us as our Lord can bless us. Our God is a God who delights in blessing His people. So it seems to me that if we want to experience the fullness of God's blessings, then perhaps we need to rethink our position of facing the trials that come in life.

Now, don't think I have suddenly developed a martyrdom complex as if I'm trying to get all of us to start looking for ways we can make our lives more difficult just so we can experience more of God's blessings. I'm not advocating that at all. However, I have found times in my life when I have refrained from ministry and service simply because of the difficulty I might face or the inconvenience I may have to endure.

Perhaps you've experienced that as well. You know, those times when God presents us with an opportunity to minister to someone, but we'll have to change our schedule or miss out on something important to us. God may present us with a situation to be of service to someone but that might mean we will have to go without or sacrifice a little and the pain that results is just too much to bear. There might even be an opportunity to share the gospel with a friend or relative and we refrain because of the ridicule that may result or the fear of not being able to adequately explain the good news of salvation in Jesus.

Then there are the other types of suffering that come with little or no explanation like we're experiencing now. Our health might begin to fail. We might lose a job or a promotion. A friend or a loved one is suddenly taken from us and we turn our anger and bitterness toward God, and we begin to doubt His love, mercy, and grace. There are many who face such times and they turn completely away, failing the test of their faith in Jesus. I'll be the first to say that I can't explain why these things happen to us and we probably won't know until we reach our home in our Father's house. However, I believe what James says when he tells us that we are blessed when we persevere, that is, when we keep our faith and trust in the Lord our God.

We have a God who does love us. His love is forever displayed and proven to us through the cross of our Lord Jesus. How could we ever doubt so great a love as God Himself coming to earth in human form so He could redeem and rescue the likes of us? You see, it's when keep our focus on Jesus, remembering His sacrifice for us, that I believe we'll more easily persevere through the difficulties of life. We'll be more willing to go without, to sacrifice, in order to minister and serve those who need our help. We'll be able to share the gospel with those who have not heard. We'll be able to keep the faith even in those times we face the most difficult of trials that may not make any sense to us. And when we persevere through all the troubles of life, keeping our faith fixed upon Jesus, we'll receive, as James points out, the blessing of the crown of life that God has promised to those who love Him.


#### **Adult Bible Study**




## Life is Wild, but God is good.

What a hot month! But it always is, isn't it? The Soup Nite team did mighty things despite the heat. Not only did we make two meals every week for the senior program, we sometimes made three. One of our senior families is moving to Ohio to be with their daughter. This is the Miller family and they have been with us the longest. They used to eat meals when we served them over at the trailers at the Food CoOp on Hwy. 78! They came to our first Soup Nite at Highlands, but then, they couldn't make it out any longer and we have been bringing them meals since 2014! I'm very glad that they will be taken care of in Ohio, but they will be missed.



A side note... deer got into the garden a couple weeks ago. Yes, horrible. Jane said that she was almost finished harvesting for summer. She will now get ready for Fall. It's been too hot to even water, so it's all good.

Our first Soup Nite was on the 13th and we used some of the chicken thighs we ordered from the Food Bank to make meals for our regular guests who come to pick up meals on Soup NIte Mondays. This has been a constant eight families, adding up to 42 meals. Jane is working on a recipe for our first August meal using the chicken thighs, as we have a lot left from our Food Bank order. So stayed tuned.

On our second Soup Nite on the 27th, we distributed a good portion of the 1500 lb. order from the June Food Bank pick up order. It was advertised on the Food CoOp's Facebook page and Highland's Facebook page. We also passed out flyers at the CoOp last week to tell clients about it. Food items were bagged up and then put on a table under the church awning for grab and go. Signs were put up around the parking lot for which way to go in and out. Food was given away to 17 families - totaling 97 people. Not bad for a first attempt. All the leftover items will be donated to the Food CoOp. YAY!!! A huge shout out to Chris McCoy, Bonnie Hornby and Bob and Jane Statham for taking this project by the horns and getting it done. We even made it to the new Digital Sign out front of the church. See the attached photo!

Again, thank you to all who continue to help us serve, and also to those who pray for this ministry. We hope to make a large meal on the second Monday in August to pass out at the CoOp, and on the fourth Monday do another distribution of Food items. We will see how it goes. With the virus, every day it brings changes.

I will keep you posted. Stay safe and reach out anytime. Jane and I miss you all terribly.

#### **GIVING TITHELY - ONLINE GIVING**

Effective July 1, Highlands ARP is changing our online giving platform to tithe.ly. The format is similar to ones that we have been using in that donations by credit card or debit card (fees are 2.9% +\$.30/transactions) and bank transfers (1% fee) are both an option. There will be an option for you to cover the credit card fee as well.

The website is easy to understand -

- 1. You have the option of donating to predetermined funds (General Fund, Benevolence Fund, Soup Nite Ministry, Missions, etc.)
- 2. You may set up the frequency of regular gifts (weekly, bi-weekly, semi-monthly or monthly)
- 3. You may elect to cover the credit card processing fees
- 4. You may select a bank draft or a credit/debit card payment

In about 2 weeks, you will receive an email that details the specifics of the platform, but it is very similar to other online giving sites.
