After some 32 Sundays of "virtual live-stream worship", we are pleased to announce that the Highlands family will begin to worship in person again on November 1, 2020. Your Pastors and Session have not reached this decision without due consideration of several factors; and the actual deployment of our Reopening Plan's Phase 3 is contingent upon general COVID-19 conditions continuing to improve and not getting any worse between now and November 1st. Also just as a reminder, the live-stream worship services (with which HPC has been blessed for many years) will continue, as in the past, for those who are not yet comfortable participating in larger group settings.

Though not ideal, we have observed some key indicators (e.g., rates of infection and hospitalizations) showing some declining rates in the past few weeks for Gwinnett County and the state. As further information (the Session appreciates your participation), 34% of our Highlands family (22 family units) provided Reopening Survey responses, and 70% of those responding indicated they were ready to resume in-person worship.

Of course, our worship services will remain just as spiritual and meaningful as they have been during our six months of "virtual" worship. However, the COVID-19 pandemic has not completed its course yet; and we all must adhere to reasonable precautions to ensure everyone's health and safety. For example, initially for contact tracing purposes, you will be asked to register your planned attendance each Sunday. This simple process will be similar to what we've been doing for the monthly in-person Communion services. Another precaution (per CDC guidelines) is social distancing will be used in escorting attendees to their seats.

Other logistical and procedural requirements will be in place for a period of time after November 1st. Later in October, the congregation will receive a letter (via email or U.S. Mail) that provides specific information and requirements to help us "be smart and use common sense" as we resume in-person worship of our Lord and Savior. *Please review this letter before November 1st and contact any elder with questions or concerns you may have*.

<u>From the Pastor</u>

Back in the 70's, we used to watch the Flip Wilson Comedy Show. Some of you may remember it as well and how Flip Wilson would have a skit in which he played the part of Geraldine. It didn't matter what topic was being acted out there, it always came to the point when Geraldine would say with utmost sincerity, "the Devil made me do it." Of course, the manner in which it was said and the timing of it all made us roar with laughter. I guess you could say that Flip had a way of getting us to see the silliness of our trying to blame our failures and shortcomings on something that's outside of us instead of taking responsibility for our own lives.

Playing the "blame game" is nothing new to our culture although there seems to be an increase in our present age. It actually started way back in the very beginning with our first parents, Adam and Eve. After they had disobeyed God and ate the forbidden fruit, God came to them and beginning with Adam asked them what they had done. Adam replied with "the woman You gave me" indicating it was both God's and Eve's fault. So God then asks Eve why she had disobeyed, and she then said "the serpent deceived me" placing the blame on the serpent. However, as we continue in the story God revealed the inadequacy of their excuses in that He disciplined everyone involved proving to them and us that we alone are responsible for our attitudes and our actions.

We see the same thing playing out today in our own lives as we continually seek to blame others for our failures. Parents blame society or the school system for their children's poor choices. Children blame their parents because they didn't raise them properly. Church members blame the church because it didn't meet their perceived needs. Husbands blame their wives or wives their husbands. On and on it goes, and the sad thing about it all is that nothing ever improves or changes.

Now I will admit that sometimes others are involved in the struggles we have, sometimes creating a climate where we make poor decisions. However, we alone must bear the brunt of our failure to be and do all that God has commanded of us. There's not a person on this earth who will be able to stand before God on that day when He judges the nations and blame something or someone outside of themselves for their own failure to make responsible decisions and to live rightly.

As parents we need to ensure that we parent our children, "bringing them up in the training and instructions of the Lord" (Ephesians 6:4). As children we need to "honor our father and our mother that it may go well with us" (Ephesians 6:2). As husbands we need to ensure that we "love our wives as Christ loved the church" (Ephesians 5:20) and wives need to "submit to your husbands as to the Lord" (Ephesians 5:22). As church members we need to "live a life worthy of the calling you have received" (Ephesians 4:1). You see, if we all would focus on striving to fulfill our responsibilities before God and quit seeking to blame others for our shortcomings we would find vast improvement in our outlook on life as well as our attitudes and actions in life. God expects us to act as responsible, mature people and in doing so we will discover His peace, presence, and power for our lives. So please, don't play the "blame game" but take charge of your life and you will reap the wondrous blessings of our Lord.

PINEAPPLE SALAD







TITHE.LY ONLINE GIVING

Recently, Highlands ARP changed its online giving platform to <u>tithe.ly</u>. The format is similar to ones that we have been using previously, in that donations by credit card or debit card (fees are 2.9% +\$.30/transactions) and bank transfers (1% fee) are both an option. There will be an option for you to cover the credit card fee as well.

The website is easy to understand -

- 1. You have the option of donating to predetermined funds (General Fund, Benevolence Fund, Soup Nite Ministry, Missions, etc.)
- 2. You may set up the frequency of regular gifts (weekly, bi-weekly, semi-monthly or monthly)
- 3. You may elect to cover the credit card processing fees
- 4. You may select a bank draft or a credit/debit card payment
