Pizza in a Pot

- Vickie Fledderjohann
- 1 1/2 lbs ground turkey (or hamburger if preferred)
- 1 medium green pepper, chopped
- 1 medium onion, chopped
- 2-16 oz jars of spaghetti sauce
- 1-6 oz can tomato past
- 1 Tablespoon Italian seasoning
- 1/2 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1 teaspoon dried oregano
- 1/8 teaspoon crushed red pepper
- 1 box Penne pasta, cooked and drained
- 8 oz mozzarella cheese
- 1. In a large skillet, cook meat, green pepper and onion over medium heat until meat is no longer pink. Drain excess fat.
- 2. Stir in sauce, tomato paste and all spices.
- Layer 1/3 of meat mixture in bottom of crockpot, followed by 1/2 of Penne pasta and 1/2 of cheese. Repeat layers ending with 1/3 meat mixture. Make sure pasta is covered completely by the sauce so it doesn't become crunchy.
- 4. Cook on low 3-4 hours or until heated through
- 5. ENJOY!



Our Holiday time has begun! The first meal on the 9th of November was our Turkey Dinner. We had turkey, sweet potato casserole and green beans. We got turkeys cooked every which way available! It was so fun watching them come into the kitchen as each one was a work of art! LOL. We ran out of turkey by 5:30 and had to defrost some of the

pork BBQ from last year's Highland BBQ Weekend. Jane quickly made plates for guests to take home to make sandwiches! So the night ended with an all-time high of 34 families! This is the most we have ever had. There was an added blessing as our name has gotten out to other communities. Mitsubishi Electric Trane HVAC heard we could use some help, so they sent over five volunteers to help us serve in the drive thru. It was good to share what we do and for them to see the need.

We distributed Produce Boxes again from Gwinnett County. Bob Statham made a Food Bank run earlier in the week and we bagged up products and produce for 25 families. We have made sure that flyers go out to the CoOp clients to bring them over to us and so far, that has been a reminder to them to come by and see us.

Our last Soup Nite was on the 23rd. We served our classic Pizza in a Pot with Cheesy Breadsticks and Yogurt Parfaits. Thank you to all who made a crock pot of Pizza in a Pot, thank you to Cindy and Eunice for making breadsticks all afternoon and thank you once again to Mitsubishi Electric Trane HVAC for helping us serve and the donations of water and Ensure. The evening was a bit slower than we planned. The CoOp was super busy with lines around the block until after 7pm so at least we know where all our guests were. This was the last day to get food as the CoOp is closed for Thanksgiving week. We were able to freeze most of the breadsticks and pasta left over for our senior meals in December. It's all good.

All four routes of seniors were delivered meals this month. We doubled up on Routes 4 and 1 due to the CoOp closing for Thanksgiving, but everyone was still able to get two meals Highlands Presbyterian each. Our seniors are still



well and no hospitalizations this month. YAY! Our friends at Friends of Gwinnett Seniors have offered to give us a monetary donation for meals for our seniors. We hope to receive that soon so that December meals will be easier without all the stress of the holiday events. I hope to contact local restaurants to get the meals ready made so it's easy to pack up for the senior routes.

We have been using our new equipment, the reach-in freezer and Cambro Go Boxes are a blessing. I posted on Instagram our Cambro boxes and tagged them. Cambro put us on their Instagram story too! It's good to support each other and see what others are doing in the community of meal prep for the food insecure. During this holiday season, please remember to pray for those in need. The need is great this year. Food Banks are doing the best they can to distribute food, but the need is dire. It's growing daily. Your prayers are needed as we work together, one community at a time. Thank you for your patience, willingness and encouragement. God has blessed us

tremendously so let's pass it on. Our only December Soup Nite is on the 14th. Shepherd's Pie is on the menu with homemade cookies for dessert. We will also distribute produce boxes and food items on the 16th. It will be a busy week. If you would like to help, we welcome it! Thank you for all you do!

Again, search for Highlands Presbyterian Church and make that selection. When you shop at Kroger, simply give them your Kroger Plus card and a percentage of your purchase will benefit Highlands.

Soup Nite occasionally needs to purchase food items and supplies as the number of families they serve continues to increase. Missions giving will allow HARP to increase support for our current missionaries or to support new ones. The team also wants Highlands's members to know that while we don't endorse these companies, they provide the rewards programs that we are aware of. You might be enrolled in a program that provides similar rewards – if you do, contact the office and we can look into it. This year, with five members participating in these online programs, they have generated more than \$125 in donations to our church.
