EASTER WORSHIP 10 AM

From the Pastor

"Behold! I tell you a mystery. We shall not all sleep, but we shall all be changed, in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, and the dead will be raised imperishable, and we shall be changed. For this perishable body must put on the imperishable, and this mortal body must put on immortality. When the perishable puts on the imperishable, and the mortal puts on immortality, then shall come to pass the saying that is written: "Death is swallowed up in victory."

(1 Corinthians 15:51-54 NIV)

The resurrection of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, is the greatest accomplishment of God's great plan of redemption and is a wonderful promise given to us as we too will share in a bodily resurrection at the last day. This year we've been looking at various promises of God given to us in His Word, and I believe the promised resurrection of God's people, those who've come to genuine faith in Jesus, is our greatest hope as we move ever closer to our Lord's return as it points to a bright and eternal future with Jesus.

In 1 Corinthians 15, the Apostle Paul gives us a very descriptive argument regarding the necessity of Jesus's resurrection after His sacrificial death on the cross. The Apostle Paul tells us in verses 12-19, as he argues much like a lawyer would in a court of law, that it's only because of our Lord's resurrection that we have hope as it's God's stamp of approval on the atoning sacrifice of Jesus on our behalf. He tells us that if Christ has not been raised, then we're still in our sins as the payment wasn't sufficient and that our faith in Him will be in vain. However, since Jesus has been raised, as is proclaimed in all the gospels, then we have every reason for hope in our resurrection as we're transformed from bodies of disease and death to glorified bodies that will never experience such again.

Now, we don't actually know how all this will take place as the Apostle Paul calls this a mystery yet to be revealed. What we do know is what the Apostle John tells us when he writes: "Beloved, we are God's children now, and what we will be has not yet appeared; but we know that when he appears we shall be like him, because we shall see him as he is" (1 John 3:2 NIV). There's a lot there regarding what we have yet to experience. However, we know that we'll be like Jesus and I believe that'll be revealed both in our spiritual and physical lives. We'll be like Jesus in holiness where we'll never fall prey to sin again and we'll be like Him in glorified bodies that'll never experience disease, death, or anything else that came about because of humanity's fall into sin.

Can you imagine that moment, that in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet, the tombs of all those who've passed on before those still alive are opened and the glorious resurrection of the saints commences and that while those still alive are watching this occur, they too are transformed from perishable to imperishable, mortal to immortal? Maybe we have a picture of what that will look like, but I can promise you it'll be far more glorious than we can ever imagine. Death will then be swallowed up in victory and all of us who've believed in and followed Jesus will live and reign with Him in a new world, a restored paradise, for all eternity.

You see, regardless of all the issues we face in this life, this life isn't the end of all things. We have the wondrous promise of a better life to come which gives us every reason to hope and continue on toward the day when our Lord returns. It's all because of our Lord's resurrection that we can say with all the saints, "Even so, come Lord Jesus!"

Lemon Cake

Shortcuts like cake mix and instant pudding leave more time for dessert.

1 pkg (15-16 oz) lemon cake mix 1 pkg (3 oz) lemon instant pudding 1/2 cup vegetable oil 1 1/3 cups water 2 eggs 1/2 cup orange juice1/2 cup confectioners' sugarWhipped topping (optional)Lemon zest or thin lemon slices (optional)

- 1. Preheat oven to 350F.
- 2. In large bowl, combine cake mix, instant pudding, oil, water and eggs. Pour into 13x9-inch pan. Bake 30-40 minutes or until cake is golden and cooked throughout.
- 3. Meanwhile, whisk together orange juice and confectioners' sugar
- 4. Cool cake slightly. Using fork, make holes in top. Pour juice mixture overtop. Serve with whipped topping and lemon zest or lemon slices, if desired. Refrigerate any leftovers.









Highlands MMO & Preschool is reaching out to our community to provide quality Christian childcare and instruction for families with young children.




Hi All,

We have had a very busy burst into Spring! On our 1st Soup Nite, on the 8th, we served hamburger soup with mini croissants. We had 14 crock pots and used every one of them that

night! It was a beautiful day, and we had many guests in the drive thru line. Some guests, who were once new, are very much familiar to us now! I enjoy seeing them and hearing about how much they enjoy our meals or not. LOL. But no matter what, they are very grateful! We had some help from Camille and Jonathan, from Faith Church, on the serving line. It helped Bob out since his foot is still healing and really shouldn't be standing so much. Praise God for all the help.

On our 2nd serving, we had chicken teriyaki on the menu with mixed vegetables. We didn't make as much as we usually do because the CoOp hasn't been overwhelmed with people coming by them. With stimulus checks and tax refunds, the need has lessened, or so we thought. It must have been what was on the menu because we served 194 meals on this Soup Nite! Lots of new people and also familiar faces. I have to laugh because I should have known when I saw 3 of our serving volunteers pull up in the parking lot that the Lord has plans for us! There were so many cars in line, that I wondered how this was



going to work out. Jane and her team in the kitchen were scrambling and putting out rice and vegetables like I never saw! Another fishes and loaves story for our Soup Nite. We did run out of chicken teriyaki but since Bob made a Food Bank run

that very day, we were able to give out a couple dozen frozen meals. It was ALL Good!

Our Distribution Day on the 25th was loaded with frozen meals, fresh zucchini and lots of snacks to get thru Easter and Spring Break. It was a gloomy day with the sun peeping out for about 5 minutes, but there was a line of cars waiting on us to open before 11am. And.....we passed out all the food in 30 minutes! It was a total of 906 lbs. Crazy, just crazy. The need is still great.

Our Senior Meal program is going along just fine. This month we still picked up some meals from LettumEat, and Joy Community Kitchen donated some Salsbury steak meals for one of the routes this month! We also served baked macaroni, and beef and broccoli over rice. Sadly, we lost Mr. Jefferson this month. His daughter, Denise, sent us a lovely note saying how much she appreciated what we do!

Thank you to all the volunteers! The kitchen seemed back to normal last serving. It's still awkward to roll meals out of the kitchen to the Narthex (not sure that is the correct term) for the drive thru, but now volunteers who used to do pre-Covid jobs are now doing them our "new normal"


way. I hope everyone has a Blessed Easter. We have some time off until we serve again on April 12th!


