From the Pastor

"In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the One and Only, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth."

(John 1:1,14 NIV)

Christmas is the most wonderful time of the year for most of us. It's a time of festivity in which we decorate our houses, our workplaces, and our church buildings with all the lights, ornaments, and other decorations that signify the season. It's a time of joyous celebration in which we sing wonderful songs that bring cheerfulness to our hearts. It's a time in which we give gifts to each other that express our love and generosity. It's a time in which we, as Christians, remember the greatest gift given to us by our Creator – the great gift of salvation that comes through the sacrifice of the Son of God, Jesus Christ.

As I notice all the joy being expressed in our culture during the Christmas season, I often wonder how many are really celebrating the gift of God and how many are just going through the motions. Do we really grasp what happened on that night so long ago? Think about that for a moment. God, who has existed from all eternity, who alone is perfect in every way, who is fully satisfied in himself, who created all that is and ever will be, this God left the splendor and glory of heaven. He stepped into time and space, into the muck and misery of our lives, becoming a human being in every aspect, so that He might relate to us on our level and then become the very One through Whom we find our salvation.

The more I contemplate the mercy, grace, and love of our Lord the more amazed I become. To think that our Creator would love us so much that He would personally come into our world to save us is just beyond my comprehension. The Apostle Paul tells in his letter to the Romans that "at just the right time, when we were still powerless, Christ died for the ungodly. Very rarely will anyone die for a righteous man, though for a good man someone might possibly dare to die. But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:6-8 NIV). Here we are, the rebellious enemies of God, and He comes to make peace with us by giving His life for us. It was our sins that sent Jesus to the cross, but He went willingly, out of His great love for us so that He might bring us home to Himself. Now if that doesn't warm your heart, something's wrong.

As we progress through the Christmas Season this year it's my prayer and my hope that all of us will be so moved by the great love of God revealed through the gift of His Son, that we'll want nothing more than to express our gratitude and love to Him through the gifts, great and small, that we can share with those around us.

TOY DRIVE

The Community Outreach ministry team has decided this year to participate in a new outreach. Pride for Parents is a community-based toy drive that benefits families in the historic South Atlanta neighborhood.



The plan is quite easy – Highlands collects toys which are delivered to the Pride for Parents toy drive in South Atlanta in time for their toy sale beginning December 16th. Items are priced at garage sale prices and parents are able to purchase specific toys for their children. If they are unable to pay even these low prices, parents are allowed to work in the



store in exchange for vouchers which they use to buy items for their children.

What would you buy? Whatever you purchase for your children or grandchildren, buy an extra one for the toy drive. If you need ideas, you can visit FCS' links to <u>Target</u> and <u>Amazon</u>. Toys range in price from \$6 for card games up to \$40 for child-sized basketball games or scooters. If you choose to donate cash, someone can shop for you.

For our first November serving on the 8th, we served vegetable soup, warm rolls and for dessert, a whole pound cake per family with chocolate sauce! I had one guest text me asking if she should add meat to it. Guess that this is our first vegetarian meal in a while and people just don't understand it. LOL. I was not present for this Soup Nite, but Jane tells me it was GREAT! Thank you to all the help to set up and prepare. The Drive Thru line ran smoothly and there was only a cup and a half of soup left over! A large crowd for us on a beautiful Fall evening as the sun went down early!

At our second serving in November on the 22nd, we served turkey and rice soup with crackers and cupcakes/cookies for dessert. We weren't sure how this serving was going to go. It was the last day that was opened before the CoOp closed for the Thanksgiving holidays and also the school kids were off the whole week. However, we gave out 144 meals and even though it wasn't a steady flow of cars, it was still a full flow of people requesting meals!!! Thank you for those who prepared and for those who helped served on the blustery, cold evening!

We didn't have a Distribution Day this month, but we are doing a Food Bank run on the 30th. We will have food items to hand out on December 16th when we receive Gwinnett County produce boxes. This will be good to do as we only have one Soup Nite in December due to the

4th Monday being right after the Christmas weekend. We will give our team and our guests time to be with family and loved ones. Therefore, our only Soup Nite in December will be on the 13th and we are serving Beef Stroganoff!

Our senior meal program has been going very smoothly. We missed one because I was out of town. We made meals for a double route because of Thanksgiving week, senior delivery Tuesday was closed, so that week's routes were pushed ahead. Thank you to the 4 ladies who made meals for those routes. I certainly needed help for those 36 meals! All in all, we serve 44 seniors 2 meals each month. I was told by the Seasoned With Love director that one senior just loved our meals and was grateful she had something already prepared to eat! Awe...

A letter came to Highlands Church with \$40 cash in it this past week. It just said that her and her family were grateful to Highlands and thanked us. It wasn't signed but addressed from a Mrs. Henderson. The address was in Snellville. I'm thinking it is from a Soup Nite family, although I don't believe that I know a Mrs. Henderson. We don't know everyone's name as they come thru the drive thru. Some we know only because they have been coming to Soup Nite for so long. A handwritten note and \$40, to me was more special than gold. As always, it's good to look back and see how God has blessed us. It's just as good to look forward and be excited to see how God will bless us.

Prayer Items


- Kaity Wright has started her chemotherapy. Please pray that Kaity will handle this treatment well and that it will be successful. Pray for her strength and endurance.

If you shop at Kroger, you can register for their rewards program at www.krogercommunityrewards.com. Log into your account with the email address you used to enroll for a Kroger Plus card (If you don't have one, you will need to



acquire one first). Again, search for Highlands Presbyterian Church and make that selection. When you shop at Kroger, simply give them your Kroger Plus card and a percentage of your purchase will benefit Highlands' ministries.



Another program is called iGive. This site www.iGive.com is an online shopping mall with thousands of stores which donate a portion of each purchase to your favorite cause. Again, simply iGive.com log in, search for Highlands Presbyterian Church in Georgia, select and shop! It's that easy.

The Finance and Stewardship team has recommended that any donations generated through these programs benefit two ministries of Highlands – Soup Nite and Missions. Soup Nite occasionally needs to purchase food items and supplies as the number of families they serve continues to increase. Missions giving will allow HARP to increase support for our current missionaries or to support new ones. The team also wants Highlands's members to know that while we don't endorse these companies, they provide the rewards programs that we are aware of. You might be enrolled in a program that provides similar rewards – if you do, contact the office and we can look into it. This year, with 10 families participating in these online programs, they have generated more than \$200 in donations to our church. Imagine what it would be if more of us took advantage of this service! Please consider participating in one or all three of these programs.
