From the Pastor

“And let us not grow weary of doing good, for in due season we will reap, if we do not give up. So then, as we have opportunity, let us do good to everyone, and especially to those who are of the household of faith.”

Galatians 6:9,10 ESV

Here we are at the beginning of a New Year with all its hopes and dreams as well as the many challenges we might have to face. Can you believe that it's 2022? Time certainly does seem to fly by us at an incredible pace especially for those of us who are older.

One of the habits many people do at the beginning of a New Year is to make a bunch of resolutions they intend to keep. Often, those have to do with personal goals regarding losing weight, exercising more, and maybe spending more time with family and friends. As Christians, perhaps we might even make a resolution to read through the Bible (that's a great one by the way) this year. Sadly, we also can fall short of achieving those goals as we sometimes just quit; we give up.

In our passage above the Apostle Paul is encouraging us to make one very important goal for our lives which is to do good to everyone. That's certainly a great calling for us as believers in and followers of Jesus and can quite often reveal the reality of God's powerful grace at work in our lives. I honestly believe this should be a daily resolution although it can certainly start as a newly determined goal each and every year.

However, in order to fulfill that resolution, we will have to follow through on exactly what he tells us in that passage when he says: *“let us not grow weary of doing good.”* You see, the issue we often face is when we get to the point where we wonder if we're really having any impact at all through the good we're trying to do. The voices in our head begin to cry out: “What's the use? Nobody is appreciative and I wonder if I'm having any impact at all.” We've all been there as we sought to help others by doing something we consider good. The truth is that when we begin to entertain those thoughts, that's when the weariness starts to creep in, and we feel like giving up.

The answer to that weariness is found in the promise that's given to us: *“for in due season we will reap, if we do not give up.”* Listen, God is the One who brings the results, and He does so in His way and in His time. If something is worth doing then we should keep doing it regardless of how we feel, unless, of course, God makes it absolutely clear we need to try something else. He's promised to bless our efforts of doing good for others if we continue doing so for His glory and their good.

So, as we begin a New Year, *“let us not grow weary of doing good, for in due season we will reap, if we do not give up.”*

Some of the ladies then delivered the packages they had wrapped and some men volunteered to deliver the presents to the widowers! I had the privilege of delivering just a few myself! Everyone was so thrilled to be remembered, and so thankful for the thoughts and prayers and gifts! A total of 175 gifts were delivered. Here are just a few comments:

"There's just a hole in my heart that I can't seem to fill! Thank you for remembering me! This gift will help so much!"

"We have been in the hospital 3 times in the last 3 months—but we got to come home each time! So these gifts came at just the right time! We needed it!"

"We miss you so much! You're making me cry giving me these presents! It's so hard, especially at Christmas!"

One just cried! Tears streaming down her face! So thankful and grateful and needing our prayers and so glad to be remembered!

"Each gift and verse brought a moment of grounding and a reminder in what the season is all about, and on who should be our focus. Each day of the season it reminded us of this focus and brought us some much needed respite."

"We just want to thank the church for the lovely gifts. What a blessing! They came at a good time. The scriptures on the gifts are wonderful. We look forward to opening our present each day."

Over 25 church families were blessed with gifts reminding them of the promises of the Savior this Christmas. These families included those that were home bound, had health issues, or were widows or widowers.

It is the desire of the officers of Highlands Presbyterian Church that each member finds their passion for ministry and serve on that ministry team. The church is most effective when each member does his or her part toward making the Kingdom of God known. Please prayerfully consider what your part will be in 2022.

The Highlands Ministry Team Handbook states God's Word tells us that all things are to be done "decently and in order" (1 Cor 14:40). The Handbook is a means to help us minister to each other, to our community and to the world. The handbook contains guidelines for each ministry team, both leaders and members, enabling them to have a clear vision of their task at hand. Without structure and guidelines, how do we access the impact of our ministries?

The biblical basis for Ministry Teams is found in Ephesians 4:7, 11-13 - *But to each one of us grace has been given as Christ apportioned it. It was he who gave some to be apostles, some to be prophets, some to be evangelists, and some to be pastors and teachers, to prepare God's people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ.*

There are 4 basic scriptural principles that are our basis for ministry –

- Our beginning in ministry must be God and not human activity.
- Our guide for ministry must be the Bible and not human understanding.
- Our focus in ministry must be people and not programs.
- Our goal for ministry must be a mature church and not a social club.

Two types of Ministry Teams correspond to the offices of the church - spiritual ministry of the church (under the direction of the Session) and physical ministry of the church (under the direction of the Diaconate). Both are an absolute necessity for successful ministry in the church and extreme care must be undertaken not to focus on one at the exclusion of the other. All Ministry Teams shall be under the authority and direction of the Session who shall have the final say regarding any matter that pertains to the spiritual and physical ministry and well-being of Highlands ARP.

Some of the duties of each team include meeting on a regular basis, establishing goals based on the needs of the congregation and the community and evaluating programs every year. Each team should also prepare a budget each year and recommend ideas to the Session for new programs.

Here's a brief description of each of the teams:

Spiritual –

Worship & Music - promote the full and well-rounded worship of God by the congregation of Highlands ARP.

Christian Education - equipping of the members of Highlands to serve Jesus Christ and His Church through Christian ministry that will enable people of all ages to grow in their relationship with Him.

Missions & Evangelism - promote the gospel in Grayson, the local communities & beyond.

Physical –

Administration & Supplies - to ensure that all the necessary materials are available for use by the programs and ministries of the church.

Building & Grounds - maintenance of, and improvements to, the physical property of Highlands ARP. The team seeks to ensure good stewardship and witness of the church building and grounds through proper care and maintenance.

Stewardship & Finance - all matters relating to the financial aspects of Highlands ARP. It shall strive to encourage faithful stewardship of all the resources that God so graciously provides.

Congregational Care - ministering to the physical needs of our congregation through personal contact and care, solicitation of prayers from the congregation, and expressions of sympathy.

Community Involvement - ministers to the needs of our community, promoting the name/programs of the church in the community, and facilitate personal contact with those who visit Highlands ARP.

Hi All,

December Soup Nite is in the books. We only had one serving this month as the second Monday is the day after Christmas weekend and no one would be around for that one, so we canceled it. However, we did have a Distribution Day or should I say two Distribution Days. On the 13th, we served Beef Stroganoff with green beans and chocolate croissants for dessert. At the same time, we passed out food pantry items that were bagged and weighed. It was a busy night but still not as busy as we had food for, so the leftovers were brought over to the CoOp the next day for their Tuesday volunteers to bring home. The rest of the leftovers were frozen and saved for our senior meal program. Our second distribution was on the 16th and we gave out fresh produce boxes from Gwinnett County. There were 37 households that came to the drive thru for fresh carrots, oranges, apples, cucumbers and onions. It's all good!

Speaking of our senior meal program, we did a double route on the 14th because the CoOp is closed until the first week in January so all routes left for the month went out on the 14th. There were 18 seniors given two meals each of roasted pork loin, green beans and pineapple casserole, lasagna and or bake macaroni and also Shepherd's Pie. Yummmm.....36 meals in all. Thank you to all who made meals for the seniors. If you would like to make a meal in January, please let me know. The routes pick up again on January 4th.

It's the end of the year! All done! Can you believe it? We have been so blessed this year. The drive thru is working beautifully and the kitchen is back to full capacity! Beside these blessings there were other really great things that happened, like a \$5,000 grant to get a new reach-in refrigerator and insulated food carrier bags! Also, two new Board members were added. They are Pastor Steve Mason from Faith Church and Rachel Bratley. Yay!

Our homeless young man from the summer brought new prayer requests our way. We served over 200 people several times in the summer. All great things to ponder on. Yet, we had some losses too. Mr. Winfrey passed away. Dionne Robinson's son was killed. They were all part of our Soup Nite family and we still mourn their loss. We gave out 3,821 meals for Soup Nite and 880 meals for Senior Meals. It's crazy that our small but mighty team of servants prepared and distributed 4,700 meals in 2021, a pandemic year. So, it has been a year to look back on and praise God for His blessings and tender mercies to us. We look forward to our 10th year of Soup Nites and a huge celebration in September 2022. Jane and I hope our great Lord will shine His face upon you in the New Year! Merry Christmas. Stay safe and healthy.
