<u>From the Pastor</u>

And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it. (Matthew 16:18 ESV)

One of the most sought-after answers in church life is found in the question "How do you grow a church?" To answer that question, we need to understand some important aspects regarding church growth.

The most important truth we need to grasp is that we don't grow the church, God does! Jesus said, "I will build my church!" Building a church is a super-natural process in which the hearts of individuals are transformed from being rebels against God to lovers of God. God must do the work of transforming the heart, not us.

However, we also need to recognize that God uses ordinary people like you and me to carry out His work. The Church is a unique blend of God's super-natural working as well as the very common aspects of our personal witness to the gospel of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. But what is our involvement in God's work?

First, we need to pray! Nothing will ever happen in the spiritual realm unless we get on our knees seeking God's blessings on Highlands. Second, we need to get our own lives in order, living out the faith we claim, letting others see Jesus in us. Third, we need to be willing to get involved, both in the church and in our community. That means ministry where we use our gifts in service to others, building relationships with them that are based on a real concern for their welfare, both physically and spiritually, drawing them to the Savior and even sharing the gospel with them. Finally, we need to invite our friends, neighbors, families, co-workers, and yes, even those who might not be inclined toward us to come.

Sometimes those not familiar with the church are often nervous about coming. However, as we often do in May each year, we have what we call, a community cookout which is a great time to invite people within your circles of influence to come and get to know the people of Highlands. We'll not only have great food but will also have a water slide and other fun events for the children and the adults can sit while the children play and talk with each other. Perhaps God will use this fellowship time to deepen relationships so they might be open to attending worship where they will hear and maybe respond to the gospel.

I am convinced that God will continue to grow Highlands in His time and for His glory. But I also know that it will take a lot of work on our part to accomplish this task. Are you ready to go to work? How bad do you want to see Highlands grow? Well, let's get real with God and see how real He will get with us.














The journey of a pint of lifesaving blood begins with YOU.

HIGHLANDS BENEVOLENCE FUND POLICY

Galatians 6:10 states "Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers." Highlands' officers used this verse, among others, as the basis for establishing a Benevolence Fund Policy to benefit our church family. They recognized that sometimes the need for charitable assistance seems overwhelming but they also were aware that the Lord says, "...whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me."

The Benevolence Fund Policy is administered by a team of three deacons, one from each class of officers, assisted by one Elder and having oversight from the Diaconate Chairman and the appointed Elder. The team has the responsibility of reviewing applications for assistance and either approving or denying those requests. They are also responsible for encouraging donations from the church membership for the Benevolence Fund.

Requests for assistance may be made by a church member, an immediate family member or regular visitors and the need should be of a critical nature that the requestor is unable to meet on their own. A request may be made of any active officer or one of the church pastors. One of these leaders may assist in the application process with the intention of turning over the request to a team member. It is the intention of the officers that these gifts

be a one-time gift, but it is also recognized that unusual circumstances do occur. Confidentiality and promptness in handling these requests are encouraged.

Gifts to the Benevolence Fund are given freely and unconditionally, without regard to a specific need and over and above the tithe. Members are encouraged to give generously as the Lord convicts you.
