From the Pastor

You, however, are not in the flesh but in the Spirit, if in fact the Spirit of God dwells in you. Anyone who does not have the Spirit of Christ does not belong to him. But if Christ is in you, although the body is dead because of sin, the Spirit is life because of righteousness. If the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, he who raised Christ Jesus from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through his Spirit who dwells in you.

Romans 8:9-11 ESV

As believers in and followers of Jesus we all have received the Holy Spirit who lives within each and every one of us. In the passage cited above the Apostle Paul makes it quite obvious that if we're truly Christians then we have the Spirit within us. If the Spirit is not within us then, as he also states, we aren't Christians. His point is that the two, becoming a believer and having the indwelling Holy Spirit, go hand in hand.

June 5th is Pentecost Sunday in which we're to be reminded of the presence and power of God the Holy Spirit who lives within us as believers in and followers of Jesus. Several years ago, I preached a brief study of the person and work of the Holy Spirit and perhaps at some point in the coming years we'll look at it once again. However, I thought it would be good for us to be reminded of some of the work regarding what the Holy Spirit does in us.

- 1. The Holy Spirit Convicts Us of Sin that is, He convinces us of our guilt before God so that we can grasp our need of Salvation.
- 2. The Holy Spirit Converts Us to Saints that is, He applies the atonement of Jesus to us and enables to believe that we might be saved.
- 3. The Holy Spirit Certifies Us with Surety that is, He becomes the down payment of God that secures and seals us for the day when salvation will fully come.
- 4. The Holy Spirit Counsels Us from Scripture that is, He is the Author of Scripture and is the One through Whom that truth can be grasped.
- 5. The Holy Spirit Conforms Us through Sanctification that is, He assists us in understanding those areas in our lives that need transformation and then enables us to live in holiness.
- 6. The Holy Spirit Consecrates Us for Service that is, He has given us spiritual gifts to be used for the common good and empowers us for service to those around us.
- 7. The Holy Spirit Convinces Us of Salvation that is, He bears witness with our spirits that we belong to God and that our salvation is real and our hope is not in vain.
- 8. The Holy Spirit Comforts Us in Sorrow that is, He instills peace and confidence in our lives when we find ourselves having to face the struggles and difficulties of life.
- 9. The Holy Spirit Covers Us by Supplication that is, He intercedes with words that we cannot even begin to grasp as He conveys the deepest desires of our hearts to God.
- 10. The Holy Spirit Commissions Us as Spokespersons that is, He works in and through us as we live our lives in testimony to the world of the great and wondrous grace of God.

The life of the believer truly is an amazing journey. Is it any wonder the Apostle Paul could say with such confidence: What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, how will he not also with him graciously give us all things?

(Romans 8:31, 32 ESV)



I cannot express the excitement we had in facing the challenges over this month's servings! We had decided at the last Board meeting to make all meals using Food Bank food items in the church's kitchen to adhere to our contract with them. Our first challenge was to make an Italian dish with pasta and lots of cheese and guess what.....? Jane found a recipe that allowed us to not have to cook pasta all afternoon. It called for the pasta to be cooked raw in a crock pot. Who knew??? and it turned out fantastic! Actually, we served 197 meals of it!!!! That's a lot of crock pots. We had two crews of volunteers, a morning crew to prep and an afternoon crew to serve. It was great! The second challenge was met too, as we made it through the day!

Our second serving in May was fish sandwiches with Spring veggies and we also had a Food Bank run to pick up more food items, in the rain!!! The first challenge was to not get wet. LOL. Bob had the truck covered in plastic drop cloths and the rain stopped so we could unload without getting wet. YAY! Next challenge was to cook 175 breaded fish burgers in the oven. Jane kept the oven going, timing and turning trays out. Veggies were cooked on the stove and we cleared out the freezer of frozen fish meals only to make room for 6 cases of ground beef for another Soup Nite. That was the second challenge. Done! We served 183 fish sandwich meals and we were extremely satisfied and tired!

The senior meal program has gone on without a hitch. Thank you to a couple of new volunteers, the meals were a lot easier to put together this month. We now bag up two meals with drinks and sides for <u>each</u> senior on <u>each</u> Monday and bring them over to the CoOp to deliver on Tuesdays. There are a total of 32 seniors each month who get two meals per month, a total of 64 meals. Then it starts fresh again the next month. If interested in helping with this part of the Soup Nite ministry, I would like this to have its own volunteers, separate from Soup Nite, so as to not burden one person with too much. A new challenge!!!!

In June, we have a Beanie Weenie meal planned on the first Soup Nite and a pasta salad dish on the last Soup Nite Monday. I will keep you posted. We will be down on volunteers from time to time over the summer because of vacations and travel but I know that the Lord will provide for us. It's always a blessing to see how God helps us meet these challenges and holds us to a greater standard to continue to serve nutritious meals to our community. Thank you so much for your continued willingness to serve and a heart for compassion and an extraordinary generous spirit.
