NOMINATIONS

You are also encouraged to contact the nominee **before** submitting his/her name to determine the nominee's **willingness to serve**. Using submitted nominations, the Session will develop a slate of officer nominees that will be submitted for election in a December Congregational Meeting.

From the Pastor

"You do not have because you do not ask. When you do ask, you do not receive, because you ask with wrong motives."

(James 4:2b-3b NIV)

We all know that it is the Lord who builds his church. But we must also realize that God never does anything in a vacuum. As he grows his church, he uses very ordinary instruments, people like you and me, to carry out his plans.

One of the ways in which God uses us in establishing his church is found in the practice of prayer. Now I can't explain it or even begin to understand it, but I know that in some way God uses the prayers of his people to accomplish his work.

James tells us that we don't receive because we don't ask. Now, in context, he's talking about the desires of our lives and how we can fight with others over what we want to obtain or see happen. Instead, he tells us to ask the Lord, to spend time in prayer for what we desire to see accomplished. In other words, if we really desire to see Highlands grow, we need to spend time in prayer, asking God to accomplish the task.

I believe that all of us want to see Highlands grow and become a pillar of the good news of Jesus Christ in Grayson. We all want to see the sanctuary filled with people who love Christ and also love each other. We all want to see new believers being brought into the family of God; their eternal state secured in Christ. But this won't happen unless we pray.

However, it's not just any prayer that we must offer unto God. When we pray, we must also ask with the right motives. It would be so easy to slip into selfish prayer, seeking to satisfy some craving that is within us to have the largest and best church in town, making us feel good about ourselves and about the church. That's not asking with right motives.

When we pray, our prayers must always be such that God would be honored and glorified in what we are asking. We should never ask for selfish motives, or for such as to satisfy our own pleasures, but only for those things that we know would be honoring to our Lord.

Jesus has promised to build his church and we'd certainly like to see that continue to happen at Highlands, but he often waits until we begin to earnestly seek him in prayer. Our passion to see Highlands grow may well be measured by how earnestly and diligently we pray.

Are you praying for Highlands? Join with me in daily prayer that God will bless us and grow us into a church that will always seek to honor him.




2022-2023 Bible Verse – 2 Peter 3:18
