Our current Highlands' mission statement is "We exist to build a family that will glorify God and enjoy him by fostering authentic relationships to express the love of Christ and grow together in our faith." Pastor Mark says in closing each week before the benediction, "*Remember that you are going out into your mission field*." We all have a mission and we should have a clear, concise Mission Statement - one that we can remember and proclaim to all who might come to a little piece of God's Kingdom here at Highlands ARP.

text and email with 2 scheduled inperson meetings. We plan to meet for 4-6 weeks then evaluate where we stand. A final report will be sent to the Elders for discussion.

Now among those who went up to worship at the feast were some Greeks. So these came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and asked him, "Sir, we wish to see Jesus." Philip went and told Andrew; Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus.

John 12:20-22 ESV

Building a church can be an exciting and rewarding adventure. Now I'm not talking about the construction of the building itself, but the growing of a congregation. You see, by Biblical definition, the church is comprised of the people of God; those who have given their hearts and lives to Jesus.

But building a church, that is, growing a congregation takes a lot of effort on the part of God's people. Sure, Jesus made it quite clear that he was the One who is in the business of building His church. But he doesn't do it without us. In fact, His plans are based upon the involvement of you and I in bringing people to a knowledge of the Savior.

One of my favorite disciples in the New Testament is Andrew. He is not as well known as Peter, James, and John. However, he was a valuable asset to our Lord's ministry, especially in the way he connected people to Jesus.

You see, Andrew had this thing about bringing people to see and hear Jesus. He was a quiet man of great faith who was always making friends and then getting them into the vicinity of our Lord. He knew that if people could just hear the Lord speak that some of them would stay around. In fact, he was somewhat responsible for getting Peter, James, and John involved in the ministry of our Lord.

Being a Christian is more than just having an assurance that we will one day be in heaven. It also brings the added responsibility of getting others into the vicinity of Jesus so they can hear about the good news of salvation.

Like Andrew, we need to make friends of those who are still unchurched and invite them to come and hear about Jesus. Our Lord will take care of the rest, just as he did when Andrew brought so many to hear the words of our Savior. All we need to do is just get them in the door. Some of them will stick around. So, invite someone to come with you to worship our great God and Savior and we'll watch Jesus build His Church!

Jane and her team in the kitchen perfected the sauce and browning of the chicken and the whole kitchen smelled like garlic! We served over 200 meals and had to sadly turn guests away. There was a consistent line at the Drive Thru and our servers didn't get



a break until we ended at 6pm, an hour early.

Our second Monday was our 10th Anniversary Celebration! We had Chef Hank from Southern Caterers/Lettum Eat! make our menu. He made us 250 chicken melts, tomato basil soup and

chips. Austin Kulp from Special Kneads Bakery and Highlands Church donated 250 vanilla cupcakes! It was a special day and we celebrated with

balloons, huge smiles and about 40 friends gathering for a dinner of hamburgers and hot dogs after we served all 250 sandwiches by 6pm. Everyone just enjoyed themselves.



Our seniors also had some great meals this month too. Baked shells, black bean enchiladas, chicken parmesan sandwiches, just to name a few... It has been a steady meal prep for our seniors. We lost two seniors this month to cancer and quite a few are in the hospital dealing with cancer. The CoOp is discontinuing its COVID protocol and once again will meet inside the building for their placing their pantry items orders and doing the interviewing process for financial assistance. This will begin on Oct. 26th. They are unsure yet if the senior program will have its route deliverers go inside their homes. I'll keep you posted. It won't change a lot for us but packing up the containers and insulated bags may change.

What a month! My eyes are full of tears as I write this. It's been a bittersweet month remembering the past 10 years. Jane and I are so grateful for all the volunteers who have helped feed our community, grateful for the support of Highlands, grateful for the partnering of the CoOp and grateful for the guests that come thru the drive thru! We look forward to the next few months and begin our chilly weather meals with autumn chili on October 10th! Thank you, thank you for your continued willingness to serve. God is always good.

2012 ... Our first Soup Nite started out with an incredible team of volunteers! It was an amazing time and many were blessed by it. Many people thanked the Highlands volunteers, and I know it was much needed!

2013 ... A family that came with a newborn also had a small girl who played a guessing game with Sal. He was asking her to guess the title of a story if he gave her the characters. She was very smart and guessed all the nursery rhyme stories and the Disney stories. She didn't know the story of Christmas with Mary and Joseph! Her grandmother said that she won't know that one, because she's Muslim. Wow! Please pray for this family and thank God that He brought her to us!

2014 ... We had another record number of people and there was not a single morsel of food left over! It all went to good use and to hungry stomachs! So many people came in and thanked us over and over for doing this.

2015 ... We are hoping to partner with the Atlanta Community Food Bank! Please pray for this partnership. We hope to use the food from them to serve another night a month. We can also use it to deliver to seniors who are home bound and would like and need food deliveries.

2016 ... Jane and I thank everyone of you for your prayers and continued willingness to serve. Not one of you have ever turned us down when we ask crazy, outrageous requests! All things are possible with God. :)

2017 ... Throughout this past year, we have had all kinds of greens, carrots, and tomatoes for our fresh garden salads from Jane's tireless efforts in the garden. Our Senior Meal Delivery has also been a blessing to those who are immobile and lonely who would have nothing if it weren't for their community helping out. It is always an opportunity to share Christ's love. It is sad that there is so much need in our community. However, when you see the joy of our guests and the comfort that our team brings to them, it is an encouragement to all of us. There is always hope in Christ.

2018 ... We had so much fun last night at Soup Nite! It was a delicious meal to serve and after a slow start, we didn't stop until 7 pm when we ran out of food. I sort of chuckle because God always comes thru for our team. We just hate to waste food or pack it up for another time, and once again, we didn't have to.

2019 ... Soup Night was a fun, exciting evening. I hardly know where to start. Jane and I picked up an order at the Food Bank in the morning and we loaded up the truck with free items from the grocery floor. It was a full truck load and we had many items to give away. Our guest were super excited about all of it. Our kitchen was full of help and we needed it! God blessed us with lots of help, lots of guests, and lots of joy!

2020 ... Our Soup Nite in December I was not present and you served 207 people! The most we have ever had. Last year we served just shy of 4,000 meals! WOW. I have no words. Jane and I have always said, "Well, we can only do what we can do." Somehow, we did more. This little church in Grayson, Georgia did more. We have been so blessed. God has always provided for us and we have learned to trust Him in the good and the not so good.

2021 ... We are done with 2020! What a challenging year and yet it was filled with so many blessings. Jane and I want to thank each and every one who helped serve, prepare food, ran to the Food Bank, donated money and food and for those that prayed for us. It was a time filled with exhaustion and trepidation, but also peace and contentment. God is always good.

2022 ... Our homeless young man from the summer brought new prayer requests our way. We served over 200 people several times in the summer. All great things to ponder on. Yet, we had some losses too. A regular elderly man passed away. Another regular Soup Nite woman had a son who was killed. They were all part of our Soup Nite family and we still mourn their loss. We gave out 3,821 meals for Soup Nite and 880 meals for Senior Meals. It's crazy that our small but mighty team of servants prepared and distributed 4,700 meals in 2021, a pandemic year. So, it has been a year to look back on and praise God for His blessings and tender mercies to us!

Thank God with us for this wonderful ministry! Continue to pray for our community, and those that are struggling! Thank God for Carrie and Jane!
