From the Pastor

In this is love, not that we have loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins. (1 John 4:10 ESV)

TOY DRIVE

The Community Outreach ministry team has decided this year to participate in a new outreach. Pride for Parents is a community-based toy drive that benefits families in the historic South Atlanta neighborhood.



The plan is quite easy – Highlands collects toys which are delivered to the Pride for Parents toy drive in South Atlanta in time for their toy sale. Items are priced at garage sale prices and parents are able to purchase specific toys for their children. If they are unable to pay even these low prices, parents are allowed to work in the store in exchange for

vouchers which they use to buy items for their children.

There was a glitch in the communication with the CoOp and there were not any flyers to pass out, so again we didn't get the number of guests that we prepared food for, serving only 148! Still, that is a pretty big number. However, more time is saved for preparation of senior meals. The best part of the evening was that Xavier came through the line on this Monday, so it was a great night. After so long, we had not seen him once since his Papa, Mr. Winfrey, passed away, so it was with great joy to reconnect. They are all doing well and we promised to stay connected. Another blessing of the night was that one of our guests uses our verses to tape all over her house and even in her car! It is Joshua 1:9. All is not done in vain as this is confirmation that God has blessed our guests by our ministry.

Senior meals were delivered two weeks out of the month. Warren has graciously offered to deliver meals over to the CoOp for us. Over the holiday months, the CoOp doubles up on routes since they are closed for a week during Thanksgiving and Christmas. So to make

Prayer Items


- Vickie Fledderjohann continues her rehab for her broken ankle.

As many people continue to shop online each year, did you know that there are several ways you can generate cash for Highlands' ministries when you shop? The most popular program, called Amazon Smile, gives 0.5% of the online purchase price to the charity of your choice - Highlands! Simply visit the Amazon Smile link, type "Highlands Presbyterian Church" in the search bar, select the one in Grayson GA and your next online purchase will generate a donation to the church.

If you shop at Kroger, you can register for their rewards program at www.krogercommunityrewards.com. Log into your account with the email address you used to enroll for a Kroger Plus card (If you don't have one, you will need to acquire one first). Again, search for Highlands Presbyterian Church and make that selection. When you shop at Kroger, simply give them your Kroger Plus card and a percentage of your purchase will benefit Highlands' ministries.





Another program is called iGive. This site www.iGive.com is an online shopping mall with thousands of stores which donate a portion of each purchase to your favorite cause. Again, simply iGive.com log in, search for Highlands Presbyterian Church in Georgia, select and shop! It's that easy.

A similar site is Rakuten at www.rakuten.com. Rakuten works like iGive - create an account, then when you shop at various stores (Walmart, Target, Office Depot, JCPenny), you can generate from 1% up to 10% of your total purchase as cash back for the church.



The Finance and Stewardship team has recommended that any donations generated through these programs benefit two ministries of Highlands – Soup Nite and Missions. The team also wants Highlands's members to know that while we don't endorse these companies, they provide the rewards programs that we are aware of. You might be enrolled in a program that provides similar rewards – if you do, contact the office and we can look into it. This year, with 10 families participating in these online programs, they have generated more than \$175 in donations to our church. Imagine what it would be if more of us took advantage of this service! Please consider participating in one or all three of these programs.
