From the Pastor

"If you love me, you will keep my commandments." (John 14:15 ESV)

Have you ever thought much about your love for God? Most of us would say that we love the Lord and if someone asked, we would certainly respond with a hearty, "you bet I do!"

But let's dig a little deeper. Let's ask a more revealing question. How do I know that I love the Lord? In other words, what are the practical ways that my love for Jesus is being revealed as I live each day? Now you may be saying, "how in the world can I do that?" Well, there are three barometers that reveal how deep our love is for Jesus.

The first is in the area of our time. How do you spend your time each day? Do we use our time well, not only for ourselves but also in service to others? Are we making sure that what we do with our time ultimately is pleasing to the Lord? And what about spending time with the Lord in personal worship with prayer and Bible reading and certainly with making corporate worship a priority in our lives? The Apostle Paul tells us: "Look carefully then how you walk, not as unwise but as wise, making the best use of the time, because the days are evil" (Ephesians 5:16-17 ESV). The way we use our time will indicate our priorities in life. Even if we have to spend most of our time at our work, we can do so out of love for Jesus if our heart's desire is to glorify him.

The second barometer that measures our love for Jesus is in the use of our talents. God has made us all unique and every one of us has a place and a purpose in his creation. What are you doing with your abilities? Can you sing? Can you teach? Can you sit with the children in the nursery or help with Children's Church? The Apostle Paul tells us: "To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good" (1 Corinthians 12:7 ESV). What abilities and spiritual gifts do you have and what are you doing with them? Are you giving them completely to Jesus to be used to build up the body of Christ, whether it's in the Church itself or out in the world around us? Some gifts are Church focused while others can be used to help others which can point them to the Lord.

The third indicator is in the use of our treasures. This is perhaps the most difficult area for a pastor to touch on and yet Jesus himself said, "For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also" (Matthew 6:21). Jesus understood that the thing most important to us would be the use of our finances. He is simply saying, "look at your checkbook because it will reveal where your heart is." The Scriptures are very clear about being generous — not only with our money — but also with everything else we have received. Jesus also tells us: "Give, and it will be given to you. Good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over, will be put into your lap. For with the measure you use it will be measured back to you" (Luke 6:38 ESV).

What we do with our time, talents, and treasures will reveal how deep our love is for God. It's really a matter of obedience to the commands of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. When you look at these barometers, and evaluate what they say, how deep do you find your love to be for Jesus? Over the next several months, we're going to look at what we call the Ten Commandments so we can see how they express genuine love for the Lord as well as for each other.




